Over the past year, I've regularly gotten to Brunswick Baths. I've learned how important exercise is for my mental and physical health. I love the community at Brunny Baths – if you see me there, please don't hesitate to come and say hello! I also enjoy bouldering and maintaining my 800-day and growing Italian Duolingo streak!

#### Where would you say is your favourite spot in Merri-bek?

Hands down it has to be Merri Creek. We are so lucky to have Merri Creek running alongside our city – it is deeply valued by our community and has been an important local site for millennia, beginning with the Traditional Owners, the Wurundjeri Woi-wurrung people. The creek is what it is today because of the vision and hard work of our community, over decades, to protect and restore it.

I also love A Minor Place for coffee and food, and for delicious pizza, drinks and a game of pool with my partner Nicco, Hotel Lombardo is a new fave.

### What do you hope to achieve as Mayor?

I want to help make our streets greener and safer for everybody, whether you're walking, riding, rolling or driving.

The reality is the climate crisis demands we reshape our neighbourhoods to stop making the crisis worse, and to deal with climate impacts – including rising heat and more extreme weather events, like flooding. Imagine if we used this as a chance to build more pedestrian and cycling infrastructure, and plant more trees! We could make our city safer, greener and better for all of us.





# **Our largest** capital works program ever!



Our 4-year Council Budget 2023-27 provides \$217 million for capital works to improve services and facilities across Merri-bek.

# This is our largest investment in capital works ever.

Our goal is to ensure that whatever stage in life you're at, you can know we are investing in infrastructure and assets that will make your life in Merri-bek safe, healthy and happy.

Through our Capital Works Program we're putting \$123 million into projects including building more public toilets, renewing roads and footpaths, tree planting, redeveloping Fawkner Leisure Centre, transforming Brunswick's Saxon Street Arts and Community Hub and delivering bigger and better kindergartens.

# More space for children to learn, make friends and play.

Expanding kindergartens – such as the Turner Street Kindergarten in Pascoe Vale South, Oak Park Kindergarten, and the Derby Street Children's Centre in Pascoe Vale – mean a better environment for more younger Merri-bek residents to learn, make friends and play.

In addition to our contributions to Merri-bek kindergartens, the Victorian Government has generously contributed \$10.7 million for us to deliver up to 329 new kindergarten spaces by 2029.

Improvements to the Pascoe Vale kindergarten include a rebuild of the existing 4-year-old kindergarten room and providing an additional kindergarten room to allow another 27 yearly enrolments.

There will also be a new office, therapy room, staff room, planning room, accessible toilet and kitchen.

Merri-bek family, Amy, Cesur, four-year-old Mavi and one-year-old Leyla, attend the Derby Street Children's Centre and kindergarten. Now enrolled in the kindergarten program, Mavi has attended the centre's child care program since he was 20 months old.

Works to expand the centre are currently underway and expected to be completed mid-July 2024.

Mavi's mum Amy says the children are excited about the works.

"Mavi likes watching the workers and big machines out the window. The staff even bring in cardboard and shoe boxes from home so he can build his own buildings and robots in the centre!

"The kids have also been asked through the process what they wanted to see in the outdoor play area. It's great. They're excited about the construction."

Meet Glenroy resident Mr Kevin White.

Mr White has been a Merri-bek home library service customer for the past 4 years and has generously offered to share how much the service means to him. Mr White says:

"I am 95 and live alone after losing my wife Pat several years ago. I became depressed and very much disillusioned with life and on the advice of a friend I contacted the Glenroy Library about their home book delivery service.

"Sarah (home library service librarian) understood my situation and arranged a monthly book delivery of my favourite stories of 17th and 18th century westerns.

"For someone living alone – and there are many of us – the opportunity to be able to read a book helps in many ways to overcome the loneliness that comes in our old age.

"This is a wonderful service for those who need it the most."

Our Maternal and Child Health (MCH) service is a free, voluntary, confidential and professional health service available to all Merri-bek families of children from birth to school age.

Our MCH service is run by nurses who hold specialist qualifications in maternal and child health, and the service also links families up with a local network of other health and support services.

# Community grants program – applications now open

Our community grants program works in partnership with community groups and individuals to create a sustainable, healthy, inclusive and empowered community. This year we are dedicating more than \$900,000 to the community grants program.

The following 2 grant streams are currently open for applications:

# Community Participation Grant (for both individuals and groups)

Individual grants are for Merri-bek residents who want to pursue an achievement in their field of expertise. Grants of up to \$750 are available.

Community group grants support groups and organisations needing funding for programs and activities designed to build participation in the community. Groups and organisaton can request funding of up to \$3,000 per application.

### **Membership Activity Grants**

These grants support Merri-bek-based incorporated community groups to promote active community involvement. We're offering funding up to \$3,000 per year for 3 years.

Local group Rotary Inner Melbourne Emergency Relief Network (RIMERN) recently received a community grant to help set up their business. RIMERN's Chair Susie says:

"We're part of the circular economy, we get donations from households and businesses and then pass them on to help people in need to furnish their homes."

# Keep your home cool with help from Merri-bek!

Mercedes and her husband recently had solar panels installed on their Coburg home. They knew the cost and environmental benefits of solar but were concerned about the up-front cost. Mercedes asked if the Merri-bek Solar Program could help fund solar panels in their home.

With our support and reputable supplier partners, Mercedes has already enjoyed the benefits of solar energy.

"Installing solar has helped us a lot. Now we know about climate change, and we are doing something about it. Solar helps us with bills, but it also helps the environment, reducing the electricity we use," Mercedes says.

"It's a small way that our household plays its part to save the world. Every little thing helps."

Merri-bek City Council has 2 offers to help lowincome households save money on electricity bills. Eligible households can receive financial support from Council for 1 of the following upgrades:

# Merri-bek Solar Program

We could pay up to \$3,000+GST towards installing solar on your rooftop. Combined with other government rebates, you may be left with only a small, or even no payment, to make.

## Merri-bek Energy Upgrades

We could pay up to \$2,000+GST towards upgrades to make your home more energy-efficient. These upgrades include installing insulation and sealing up gaps around your doors and windows.
