Moreland Council Community Transport Service









The Moreland City Council Community Transport Service helps Moreland residents stay active, connected and access their community.

The service offers eligible residents an affordable transport service that is accessible and monitored to ensure your safety.

The transport service is a council funded, shared resource that tries to accommodate where possible. It comprises of small buses with hoists and safety features that can assist people who use walking aids and wheelchairs.

One of our friendly drivers can collect you from your home and transport you to your destination and can then take you back home afterwards.

Who is the service for?

- older people
- people with disability
- people who cannot drive
- people who have difficulty using public transport.



Where can I go?

- Health care appointments
- Exercise and rehabilitation programs, including allied health services
- Leisure centres and swimming pools
- Shopping
- Visiting friends and family members
- Senior's Clubs

What are the hours of service and cost?

The Community Transport Service operates Monday to Friday, 8:45am to 4.30pm.

There is a small fee for the service, please contact the Transport Team for current charges.

Fees will be invoiced to you every 4 weeks.

How often can I use the service?

As this is a shared community service, you can access the service twice a week. For example: in one week you could go shopping and attend a senior's group.

Transport required to medical appointments can be in addition to your two trips per week.



How many shopping bags can I bring?

For safety purposes, and due to limited storage on the bus people need to limit the size and number of shopping bags to either:

- 2 zipped chill bags, or
- 1 collapsible shopping jeep.

The largest floor space measurement must be no more than 55cm x 45cm.
