

Draft Council Budget delivers services and infrastructure for Merri-bek community

Council's proposed Budget 2023-27 was endorsed for public exhibition on Wednesday 12 April. We have engaged with the community and invited you to share your feedback online and inperson. This feedback will be presented to Council in June, which councillors will consider when approving the final Budget.

The proposed Budget sets out how the services and projects we provide are funded while being mindful of your cost of living pressures. We must fund these services and projects while operating within the rate cap set by the State Government.

The proposed Budget funds services including waste management, upgrades to infrastructure, community facilities and parks, operating our libraries, recreation centres, events and festivals, and services to residents at all stages of life.

Some of the highlights of the Budget in 2023-24 are:

- » \$36.9 million for the Fawkner Leisure Centre Redevelopment
- \$32.1 million to upgrade several early-years facilities over the next 5 years.
- » \$20.6 million for improving parks, open space and streetscapes
- » \$15.9 million to roads and carparks renewal and maintenance
- \$4.5 million for footpaths, bicycle paths and transport infrastructure
- \$278,000 for 6 community Budget initiatives. Our community suggested projects and voted on their preferred ideas.

Rates: Average rates in 2023-24 are proposed to increase by 3.5% to fund Council's operations and projects. This increase is in line with the rate cap set by the State Government.

This will see average rates increase by \$1.22 per week or \$63.48 per year.

Merri-bek's new 4-bin waste service is coming in July 2023

Fast facts on your new bins

Can I opt out of having a bin?

The 4-bin waste service will be the standard service for households in Merri-bek. There won't be an option to opt-out of having a food and garden organics or glass recycling bin, just like you can't opt-out of having a mixed recycling bin or general rubbish bin now.

Can I change the size of my bins?

Yes, from August 2023 you can change the size of your bins. This gives you a chance to try our standard sized bins and new collection frequencies to help decide what is right for your household. A different waste charge will apply, depending on the size of your bin.

I live in an apartment block, where are we meant to store additional bins?

Most people living in units, townhouses and apartments will use shared bins with their neighbours. We understand that some properties will have challenges with the new 4-bin system. If you would like to review how many shared bins you have at your property, your Owners Corporation, or alternative representative, may request a review. How will 4 bins improve the quality of recycling in Victoria?

Recycling well and reducing waste in the first place helps keep valuable resources out of landfill so that they can be used again and again.

Recycling reduces the need for new or raw materials and is part of Victoria's shift to a circular economy.

By separating your waste into 4 bins, more of your recycling can be turned into new things, like glass jars, mulch and compost.

Lids on or off with recycling?

Lids on!

Our recycling processor prefers lids of bottles and jars (both glass and plastic) to be attached before placing in the recycling bin. They are removed through the recycling process and sent to the right waste stream for further processing. Loose lids should be placed in your general rubbish bin as these get lost in the recycling process.

How often will my bins be picked up?

From July 2023:


- glass recycling bins will be collected monthly (every 4 weeks)
- mixed recycling bins will be collected fortnightly (every 2 weeks)
- food and garden organics bins will be collected weekly
- general rubbish bins will continue to be collected weekly

Fleming Park – refreshed for all to enjoy

So many community members use Brunswick East's Fleming Park to socialise, play sport, walk their dogs, or just to soak up some sunshine.

We have been steadily working on making the much-loved community space better for everyone to enjoy.

In 2019 we worked closely with the local community to implement the 2018 Master Plan Refresh for the redevelopment of Fleming Park, and improvements are almost finished.

Council invested more than \$8 million into the redevelopment.

Some of the works we completed include:

- » Refreshing the much-loved large grandstand and including seating
- » Extensively upgrading the existing Community Hall and Bocce Club building, including a large timber deck area and steps for socialising
- » Building a new multipurpose female-friendly sports pavilion that complies with various sports and disability access requirements
- » Constructing new public toilets and showers including family-friendly facilities
- » Adding a new multi-court and reinstating the car park
- » Improving the safety between the bike path and children's play area
- » Making landscape improvements throughout the whole park

Look after your mate, keep their registration up to date

If you own a cat or dog, it is your responsibility to ensure that you register them with Council.

Under Victorian Law, all cats and dogs must be registered.

Registration keeps a record of your pet's name and your contact information, so that we can return them to you if they get lost.

Pet registration also helps:

- » Record how many pets live in Merri-bek
- » Fund off-leash and fenced dog parks
- » Provide free desexing programs and animal welfare programs.

Pet registrations were due on April 10.

Jacobs Reserve, **Brunswick East**

Construction of the new accessible public toilet at Jacobs Reserve is now complete.

We received your feedback about the location of the toilet - that we needed to balance the needs of park users and local residents.

Young families and the elderly will now have a toilet available when they need it, while respecting the privacy and security concerns of residents.



() Open now

Anderson Park, **Brunswick East**

We've refreshed Anderson Park. The new playspace has a ropes play circuit, a nature play zone flanked by native garden beds, as well as a gentle mound slide.

We also installed a wheelchair and pedestrianfriendly concrete path inlaid with bluestone, and all new furniture made with Australian hardwood, including a picnic setting plus accessible drink fountain with dog dish.

Additional tree and garden planting has also been scheduled.

Sulva Grove, **Coburg North**

We have started road reconstruction works along Suvla Grove in Coburg North. The works will include new road pavement, vehicle crossings, kerb and channel and works and improvements on underground drainage pits and pipes.



(\) June 2023

Shore Grove, Coburg North

We have started road reconstruction works along Shore Grove, Coburg North - between McMahons Road and Carr Street. The works will include new road pavement, vehicle crossings, kerb and channel and underground drainage pits and pipes.

Moascar Street, **Pascoe Vale South**

We finished road reconstruction works along Moascar Street, Pascoe Vale South - between Gallipoli Parade and Reynard Street. These works included new road pavement, vehicle crossings, new kerb and channel and underground drainage pits and pipes. We finished works in April 2023.




